Accessibility Statement

Our Commitment to Accessibility

The University of Toronto (U of T) is committed to creating an environment that is inclusive of all persons and treats all members of the community in an equitable manner.

As part of this commitment, the University of Toronto will strive to provide support for, and facilitate the accommodation of individuals with disabilities so that all may share the same level of access to opportunities and activities offered at the University.

The University is aware of its obligations and commitments to extend accessibility for people with disabilities under the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (AODA). The <u>statement of commitment</u> regarding persons with disabilities can be found on U of T's <u>Governing Council website</u>.

Conformance status

The <u>Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG)</u> defines requirements for designers and developers to improve accessibility for people with disabilities. It defines three levels of conformance: Level A, Level AA, and Level AAA. The Rotman Commerce Centre for Professional Skills (CPS) course on Effective Virtual Communication and Presentations is partially conformant with WCAG 2.1 level AA. Partially conformant means that some parts of the content do not fully conform to the accessibility standard.

The main tool used for these materials are H5P Interactive Books. H5P lists the Interactive Book as Accessible in their <u>Recommendations and overviews of content</u> types webpage. They state that "the content types have been tested against these criteria [WCAG 2.1 AA]...[including] testing with various screen readers, keyboard navigation, zooming, code inspection and more" (2021).

Navigating the H5P Interactive Booklets

Each of these booklets has been embedded into a separate page on the Canvas Learning Management System (LMS). Section 0 has a Cover Page. Click "Read" to begin. Once you have finished a section, you can move to the next section by clicking on the "Next" button on the bottom right corner of the webpage.

Each booklet has multiple different pages. Pages contain elements such as text, videos, reflection activities, accordion tabs, and hyperlinks to additional or supplementary resources and tip sheets.

The final page of the H5P booklet is usually a Summary page. This page gives you a summary of all your interactions (quiz results, reflection prompts, etc.) throughout the section. There is an option to Submit Report. Please ignore this unless your instructor indicates otherwise.

The hamburger menu in the top left corner can be expanded or collapsed, though some screen readers may still read out the full menu regardless. When expanded, it shows the list of page headings and subheadings for that booklet. You can click on any of these to be taken immediately to the relevant page. The page you are on will be highlighted in pale blue in the menu.


To see the H5P booklet in full screen, click the "Fullscreen" button on the top right corner of the booklet.

You can also navigate to pages linearly by clicking the Previous Page or Next Page arrows on the top right corner next to the "Fullscreen" button and the bottom right corner of the booklet.

You can track your progress through the section by noting which page you are on in the top or bottom right next to the navigation arrows. There is also a blue progress bar along the top and bottom of the booklet.

Just before the bottom of the booklet, there is a blue upwards arrow that will take you back to the top of the page.

Along the very bottom of the booklet, you will find (from right to left): a link to the H5P.org site, a button to download the H5P booklet for re-use, copyright details, and in the far left, an "I am confused" button which will allow you to report any issues with the page or its interactive elements.
