License	Example
	Ali wants to let others distribute, remix, tweak, and build upon the work, even commercially, as long as they credit Ali for the original creation.
	Beck wants to let others remix, tweak, and build upon the work even for commercial purposes, as long as they credit Beck and license new creations under the identical terms.
	Cam wants to allow for redistribution, commercial and non-commercial, as long as it is passed along unchanged and in whole, with credit to Cam.
	Dana only wants others to download the work and share it with others if it's credited to Dana, the work isn't changed in any way, and it's not used commercially.
	Eniola wants to let others remix, tweak, and build upon the work non-commercially. Also, although new works must also acknowledge Eniola and be non-commercial, the derivative work doesn't need to be licensed on the same terms.
	Fran wants to let others remix, tweak, and build upon the work non-commercially, but only as long as they credit Fran and license their new creations under the identical terms.
